Are Virtual Exams Here to Stay?

INTRODUCTION

The pandemic forced many classes to pivot to the virtual environment, which included shifting exams to a virtual format. As we go back to teaching in-person, virtual exams may still have a place in our courses. ADVANTAGES OF VIRTUAL EXAMS

- Technological Issues
- Student Cannot Ask Questions
- Academic Integrity

METHODS

•Students who have previously taken a virtually proctored exam (e.g., with the use of proctorio) were asked to complete a short survey regarding proctored exams. In total, 45 students completed the survey and provided feedback.




64% of students prefer to take proctored exams virtually while 34% would still like to take their exams in-person.

OPEN COMMENTS FROM STUDENTS:

- "[With virtual exams] I feel more able to take my time and focus on the exam itself instead of worrying about the environment and students around me."
- "I like being able to take an exam virtually wherever I'm most comfortable."
- "Proctored virtual exams stress me out."
- "I don't like the possibility of interruptions or distractions that may occur at home with a virtual exam."
- "Taking a virtually proctored exam feels more invasive."

DISCUSSION

Virtual exams can provide
flexibility for students and
instructors; however, they do
present with their own set of
issues such as technological
challenges and possible
cheating. If virtual exams are
used, it may be valuable to
provide an in-person option,
and to evaluate the parameters
of the exam (e.g., randomized
questions, large question pool,
etc.)
