Interactive Tutorials for Information Literacy: Articulate Storyline for Asynchronous Learning

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
Introduction

Articulate Storyline is a software platform that enables educators to create interactive tutorials incorporating audio, video, and embedded quizzes to improve students' understanding of discipline-specific concepts, reinforce material presented in class, and assess student learning.


In 2020, Temple Libraries' introduced its TUL Tutorials Page, a collection of self-paced tutorials covering information literacy topics. Since the launch of this page, new tutorials have been added, and library subject specialists have collaborated with their departments to create discipline specific tutorials.

Articulate Storyline

- Allows instructors to create interactive electronic tutorials
- Features a variety of quiz question types that assess student learning
- Enables students to learn at their own pace
- Saves instructors time by covering new content and concepts outside of class
- Tracks students' understanding of material presented

Benefits


Research suggests that supplementing classroom content with self-paced tutorials can improve students' understanding of challenging concepts.

Interactive tutorials allow students to process information at their own pace and receive real time feedback about their understanding of new material.

Online tutorials enable students to review course content as needed throughout the semester.

Unlike static learning materials, online learning tutorials can be modified and remixed to meet the needs of specific courses and learners.

Embedding interactive tutorials in Canvas may be especially useful for improving student engagement with distance students.
