An emergency medicine physician, professor, and Temple Urban Bioethics alumnus will lead students through an exploration of trauma and how it shapes patients, healthcare teams, and medical institutions.

Students will begin with an overview of the foundational literature exploring the impact of trauma and stress on health at the individual and community level.

Next, we will use the bioethics framework to interrogate manifestations of trauma in healthcare settings, including the mechanisms through which individuals, teams, and institutions reproduce trauma and exacerbate harm to vulnerable individuals and communities.

Lastly, the class will explore potential interventions to interrupt cycles of violence at the individual, collective and institutional level.
