FYREworks (Family, Youth, and Researcher Education) is an online training that teaches people about research and how to be part of a research team.

This new unit of FYREworks teaches young adults with disabilities about how peer support can help with research. Peer support is when a person with a disability helps another person with a similar disability.

You will learn about four things during this training:

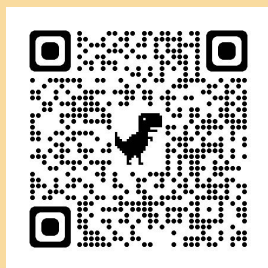
- 1) What peer support is and why it matters.
- 2) How peer support can help develop the research team through communication, team building, and creating a welcoming environment.
- 3) How peer support can help prepare the team to learn research skills, make decisions, and choose a research question.
- 4) How peer support can help during data collection, data analysis, and dissemination.
